Game Preview

Louisville City FC is in the business of winning trophies, and so far this season the club is competing on all fronts.

The club is in first place in the USL Championship and has won three games in the Lamar Hunt U.S. Open Cup — including an upset of a Major League Soccer team for the second time in club history — advancing to the Round of 16.

On Saturday, LouCity will take on yet another competition with another trophy on the line, the USL Prinx Tires Cup. LouCity hosts Fort Wayne FC of USL League One at Lynn Family Stadium, with kickoff at 7 p.m.

This is the second year LouCity has taken part in the tournament, which pits teams from across the United Soccer League structure, including the second-division Championship and third-division League One.

In last season's league cup, LouCity took one loss in the group stage, which was enough to halt their progress. Louisville failed to advance to the knockout stage and finished second in Group Five.

"It's another competition that we haven't won yet and we want to win," LouCity interim head coach Simon Bird said. "So, that's first and foremost, and it starts on Saturday."

Fort Wayne (1-2-1, 4 points) has dropped results over the opening four games of the season, but is coming off a win last time out, 1-0 against the Chattanooga Red Wolves. With a new 9,200-capacity stadium — which will look strikingly similar to Louisville's Lynn Family Stadium — under construction, the club has been on the road all year. Fort Wayne is not participating in the U.S. Open Cup.

The club is in its sixth season of existence, but first as a professional club. From 2021 to 2025, Fort Wayne competed at the USL League Two level, which utilizes collegiate players on their summer break. The club was the best in League Two, winning three consecutive regular-season titles from 2023 to 2025.

The club is coached by Mike Avery, a former college coach who has made several stops in his career, including one in the Derby City: Avery was an assistant coach with the University of Louisville men's program under Ken Lolla in 2006.

Former United States Men's National Team star Demarcus Beasley is a member of the ownership group.

Storylines...

Format: This year's USL Prinx Tires Cup includes 42 teams from the USL Championship and USL League One, split into seven groups. Each team will play four group games, meaning teams will not play every opponent in their group. The seven group winners and two wild card teams will advance to a single-elimination knockout stage. The format utilizes goals scored as a tiebreaker.

Group Four: The USL placed LouCity in Group Four, which includes four USL Championship teams — Louisville, Indy Eleven, Lexington SC and Detroit City FC — along with three from League One — Fort Wayne, Forward Madison SC and Union Omaha. LouCity will face Fort Wayne, Detroit, Omaha and Lexington in the group stage.

Shootout: If USL Prinx Tires Cup games end in a tie, there will be a penalty kick shootout at the end of 90 minutes. The winner of the shootout will earn two points in the standings, while the loser takes one.

Little brother: LouCity is 4-0-0 all-time against USL League One opposition. Since the league formed in 2019, LouCity has defeated the Chattanooga Red Wolves, Greenville Triumph and Lexington SC all in the U.S. Open Cup, as well as the Richmond Kickers in last season's USL Cup. LouCity outscored those League One opponents 9-2 in those games. All four were played at Lynn Family Stadium.

Team of the Week: The USL named LouCity captain Kyle Adams to its Team of the Week following last week's 1-0 win over Sporting JAX. The 29-year-old New Zealander won 3 of 3 tackles and 9 of 13 duels, recording six recoveries and completing 65 of 77 passes overall, in the win.

E-Town's elite: LouCity forward Jansen Wilson, a native of nearby Elizabethtown, Ky., has proven to be a consistent scoring threat. The third-year pro has three goals and two assists this season, including the game-winner last week. Overall, the 24-year-old has scored 18 goals and tallied eight assists in league play over his career.

Club History

ABOUT THE CLUB

Since starting play in 2015, Louisville City FC has consistently raised the standard of American men's professional soccer both on and off the field.

LouCity is a member of the USL Championship, America's second division league, and anticipates entering the planned USL first division launching in 2027 or 2028.

The Championship's all-time winningest club, LouCity won the league title in both 2017 and 2018, making it the only team in league history to win back-to-back titles. Additionally, City won Eastern Conference crowns in 2019 and 2022 before claiming its first Players' Shield, awarded for a regular season title, in 2024.

From 2015 to 2023, nine straight seasons, Louisville City advanced to at least the Eastern Conference Final in the USL Championship playoffs — an unprecedented run of success in American soccer.

In 2020, LouCity moved into its home Lynn Family Stadium, a purpose-built, soccer-specific facility in Louisville's Butchertown neighborhood just east of downtown. The stadium can accommodate 15,304 fans and also serves as home to sister club Racing Louisville FC of the National Women's Soccer League.

Both LouCity and Racing maintain daily operations from the nearby Lynn Family Sports Vision & Training Center, located at Champions Park about two miles east of the stadium. The facility also houses the LouCity & Racing Academy and the LouCity & Racing Foundation, the organization's charitable arm.

SIMON BIRD **INTERIM HEAD COACH**

Simon Bird took over as interim head coach on March 17, 2026.

Bird joined the Louisville City first team as an assistant in 2021, after serving in the LouCity academy.

A native of Lincoln, England, Bird's relationship with Louisville goes back two decades. He was a star at the University of Louisville from 2001 to 2004, earning Conference USA Player of the Year in 2003. He followed his collegiate career with a six-year professional career in England before returning as a University of Louisville Assistant Coach from 2009 to 2012.

A fixture on the local soccer scene, Bird has worked as Oldham Soccer Club's Director of Coaching and Kentucky Fire Juniors Boys Director. Bird holds an A License from the U.S. Soccer Federation and is a Qualified Teacher for High School Physical Education and Sports Science.



PAOLO DELPICCOLO **ASSISTANT COACH**

DelPiccolo began as a full-time assistant coach with the LouCity first team in 2026, after serving on the staff in a part-time role in 2025.

DelPiccolo previously served as the LouCity Academy's Director from 2024 to 2025.

DelPiccolo played eight seasons for LouCity, and served as the team's captain for seven of those years, including both of City's back-to-back USL Championship title runs in 2017 and 2018. The 2018 campaign brought about DelPiccolo's first coaching experience as part of the "triumvirate" of player-coaches that successfully managed through a head coaching change. LouCity lifted six trophies – four Eastern Conference titles and two league championships – during DelPiccolo's tenure. He among the club's leaders in minutes logged (15,397) and third in games (227).

He played collegiately at the University of Louisville, helping the Cardinals to their first-ever NCAA College Cup trip in 2010. The Wheat Ridge, Colorado, native holds a USSF 'B' License and is pursuing his 'A' License.



SCOTT BUDNICK **GOALKEEPERS COACH**

Budnick was brought in by LouCity coach John Hackworth in August of 2018 as interim goalkeepers coach, helping lead the boys in purple to winning the club's second-straight USL Championship title.

As a player between the posts, Budnick represented the U.S. at the U-18 and U-20 levels, participating in the U-20 CONCACAF qualification tournament in 1990. After a strong four-year career at the College of William and Mary, Budnick began his professional career in 1993 with the Richmond Kickers and then Hampton Roads Hurricanes in the USISL the following year.

Budnick spent time in the English and German lower divisions before joining Major League Soccer with the Tampa Bay Mutiny and Miami Fusion, eventually retiring with the New England

Revolution in 2000.

Making the move to Louisville in 2009, Budnick managed the Louisville Lightning of the Professional Arena Soccer League, winning Coach of the Year honors in 2010. Budnick has also assisted the Trinity and Assumption high school programs and local select youth teams.

Budnick and his wife, Shannon, have two children: Koepler and Dillon.

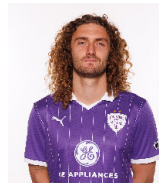
